Minor: Sustainability Transitions

2020

Since its start in 2020, this interfaculty minor for EUR bachelor students blends transition, resilience, and design thinking - and has been further developed over the last years. Hosted by EUC, it invites lecturers from six faculties (ESSB, ESHCC, Erasmus MC, ESL, ESPhil, RSM) plus external organizations. Through hands-on projects and coaching, students deepen their understanding of societal and ecological challenges. It equips them with the tools to address complex problems and is currently ending its fifth academic year 2024/2025.

TransEUR: Transforming the Erasmus University Rotterdam

2021

DIT Platform was developed as an experiment to foster institutional change at EUR. We engaged in research activities to analyse and understand current structures, and to reflexively monitor the experimentation with alternative structures at DIT. Different career paths at DIT

2021

DIT introduced new roles (e.g. DIT academics seconded for part of their worktime to DIT, or 'developer' roles) that differ from traditional university career paths blending academic and support roles and offering more flexibility. This initiative was designed to experiment with career models that support engaged, action-oriented scholarship.

We explored how universities can institutionalise action-oriented and engaged research. This project examined organisational structures and policies that support societal impact of academic activities.

Transformative Repair Research

2022

This research reimagined repair as both a practical and symbolic act of sustainability. It explored visible mending to shift cultural norms toward repair rather than disposal. The goal is to promote sustainable practices in design and everyday life.

Transforming Education

2021

This project was designed to reimagine university practices through the exploration of teacher development, systemic change, and innovative learning methodologies. By developing tools and initiatives, the project engaged students, faculty, and staff in dynamic, hands-on activities that address emotional communication, environmental risks, and ecological transformation. The goal is to inspire a more interconnected and sustainable academic ecosystem that fosters societal change and empowers individuals to navigate complex challenges.

2023

2023

2023

The Ecotones project proposed seven propositions for transforming universities using ecological metaphors. It focused on transitional spaces within academic institutions that foster new knowledge and practices. The aim was to create alternative methodologies and organizational structures for societal change.

Education Pilot: Sustainability for Education

2024

This pilot aimed at integrating sustainability into education activities in collaboration with various EUR schools (RSM, ESL, ESSB and ESE), DIT and Impact at the Core. The program classified sustainability topics, created a dedicated course, and provided staff training. It aligned with EUR's Climate Emergency Declaration to promote sustainability education.

2024

The ateliers explored and implemented creative practices to accelerate societal transitions. Transition ateliers made radical alternatives visible and actionable by engaging communities in creative problem-solving. 2024

Consulting as an academic practice

2024

In collaboration with DRIFT and the Intersectoral School of Governance Baden-Württemberg (ISoG BW), Germany, this research explored the various roles that emerge in the transdisciplinary spectrum between scientific research, consulting and action-oriented research.

The Bildung Climate School

2024

The Bildung Climate School (BCS) was a unique nine-week program offering students across different school paths ranging from MBO, HBO and WO an interdisciplinary training on climate resilience. It combined philosophy and physical activities to teach climate action skills and develop a new generation of climate-conscious professionals. DIT also engaged in creating a consortium and find follow-up funding for the BCS.
